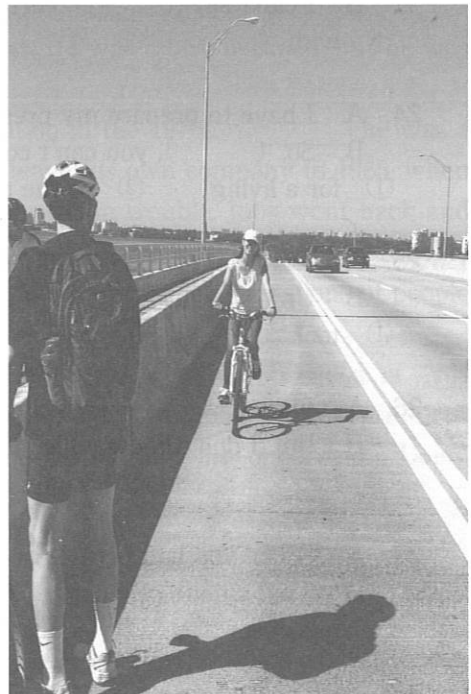

Steve Jobs, one of the two founders of the computer company Apple, died from cancer on October 5, 2011. He was only fifty-six years old.

In the days after his death, people gathered at Apple Stores around the world to remember him. They placed messages and flowers and candles outside the shops. More than a million people e-mailed messages to a website Apple set up in his memory. Millions of people talked about him on Facebook and Twitter.

The president of the United States and the prime minister of Great Britain commented on Jobs's death. The media said that the last time the public were so sad was the death of Michael Jackson in 2009 or the death of Princess Diana in a car crash in 1997.

But Steve Jobs wasn't a pop star or a princess. He was a businessman; but he was certainly no ordinary businessman.

Jobs pioneered the personal computer revolution in the 1970s. ⁽¹⁾_____ he was a millionaire at the age of twenty-five, he had to leave his own company in 1985, when he was thirty. In 1997, twelve years later, Apple was in trouble. Jobs went back and built Apple into one of the most valuable companies in the world. ⁽²⁾Stylish products like the iPod, iPhone, and iPad are now part of the everyday life of millions of people everywhere.

Why did people admire Steve Jobs so much? Perhaps it was because of ⁽³⁾his passion. He didn't care about money. He just wanted to make great products.

"Being the richest man in the cemetery doesn't matter," he once said. "Doing something wonderful . . . that's what matters to me."

The Jobs family lived in the San Francisco Bay Area. Lots of companies that produced things for the military, such as Lockheed and Westinghouse, were based there. There were also new technology companies like Hewlett-Packard (HP) and, from the 1960s, semiconductor firms like Fairchild and Intel. As a result, many of the fathers in the Jobs family's neighborhood were engineers. Jobs grew up admiring people who knew about science and technology.

At elementary school, Steve was bored, and so he behaved badly. Then in fourth grade, he got a good teacher called Imogene Hill. She saw Steve was special and arranged for him to skip a grade.

When Steve was thirteen, he decided that he did not want to be a Christian. If God knew everything, why wasn't He helping the people who were dying from hunger in Africa? That was when Steve started to become very interested in religions from other countries like India and Japan.

As Steve got older, he also became more and more interested in electronics. When he was fifteen, he put speakers around his family's house so he could listen to what was happening in other rooms. His father was not happy about that!

Steve also joined the Hewlett-Packard Explorers Club. This was a group of students who met in the company cafeteria once a week to listen to an HP engineer talk about his work.

It was at the Explorers Club that Steve first saw a computer. He also got the idea of building a machine called a frequency counter. In the phone book, he found the phone number of Bill Hewlett, one of the founders of HP, and called him. They spoke for 20 minutes. Hewlett didn't just give Steve some components for the machine for free, but he also gave him a job in the HP factory. ⁽⁴⁾Steve was always a good talker!
